- Scored five Test centuries including two double-centuries against the teams of Pakistan, South Africa, Bangladesh, West Indies and England.

Wasim Jaffer, a former Indian cricketer with a distinguished career of over 18 years, has etched his name in the annals of Cricket history. Being a right-handed opening batsman, his illustrious career includes highest run-scorer in Ranji Trophy, becoming the first batsman to score 11,000 runs in the Ranji (2018) and becoming the most capped player in Ranji trophy history with his 146th match appearance. These accomplishments have earned him the title, 'The Ranji Giant'.

In 2015, he transitioned seamlessly to mainstream roles, leveraging his extensive experience, discipline, and leadership skills developed on the field. His coaching tenure honed his ability to strategize, mentor, and manage teams, providing a solid foundation for his corporate tenure.
